

EMRS State Voting Intentions Poll

August 2018

4th September 2018



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Polling was conducted from the 29th to the 31st of August 2018.

1,000 adult Tasmanian residents were interviewed and responses weighted to reflect the Tasmanian adult voting population.

A sample of this size provides a margin of error of +/- 3.1 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.

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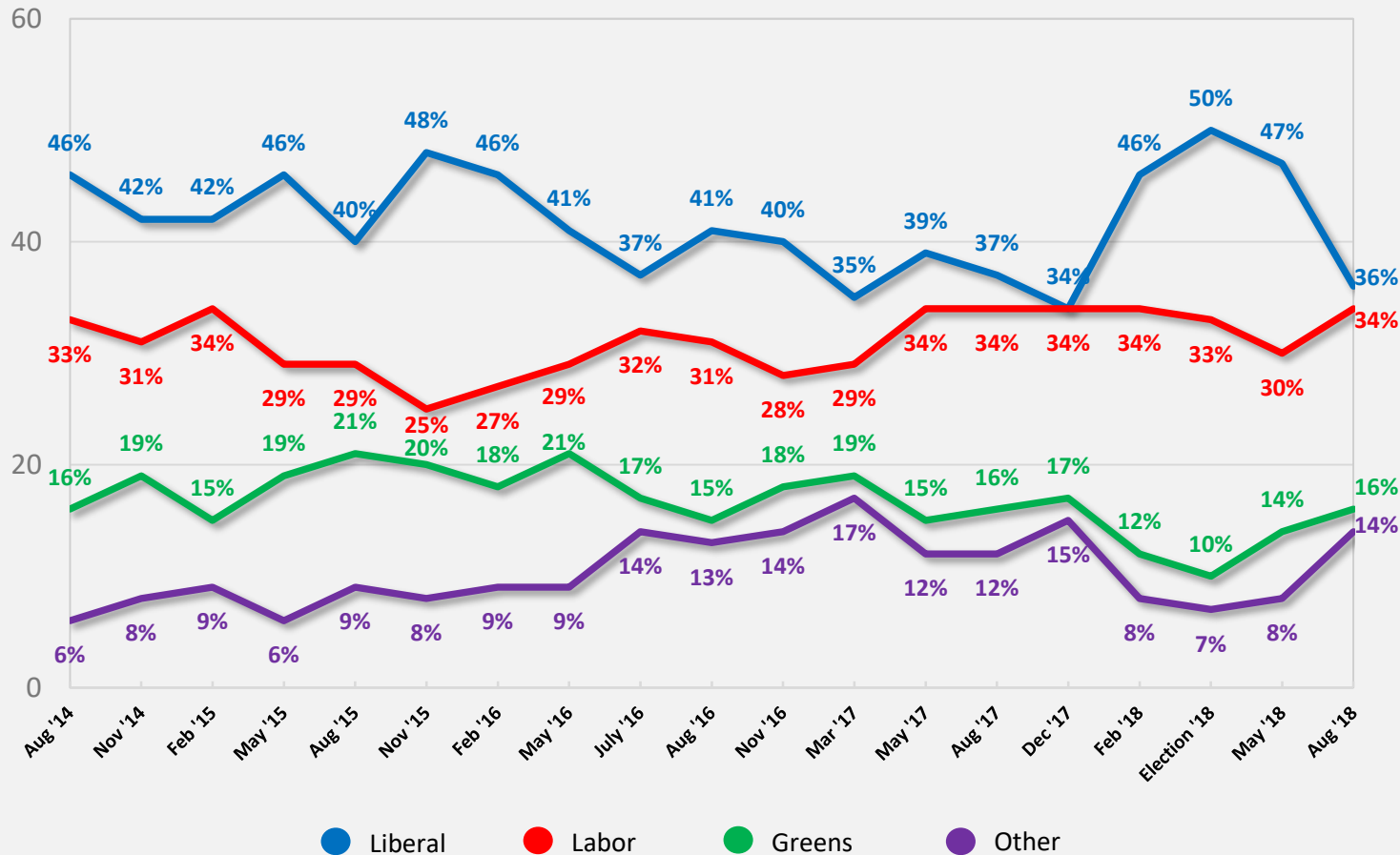

Figure 1 - Decided Voters Supporting or Leaning towards a Party



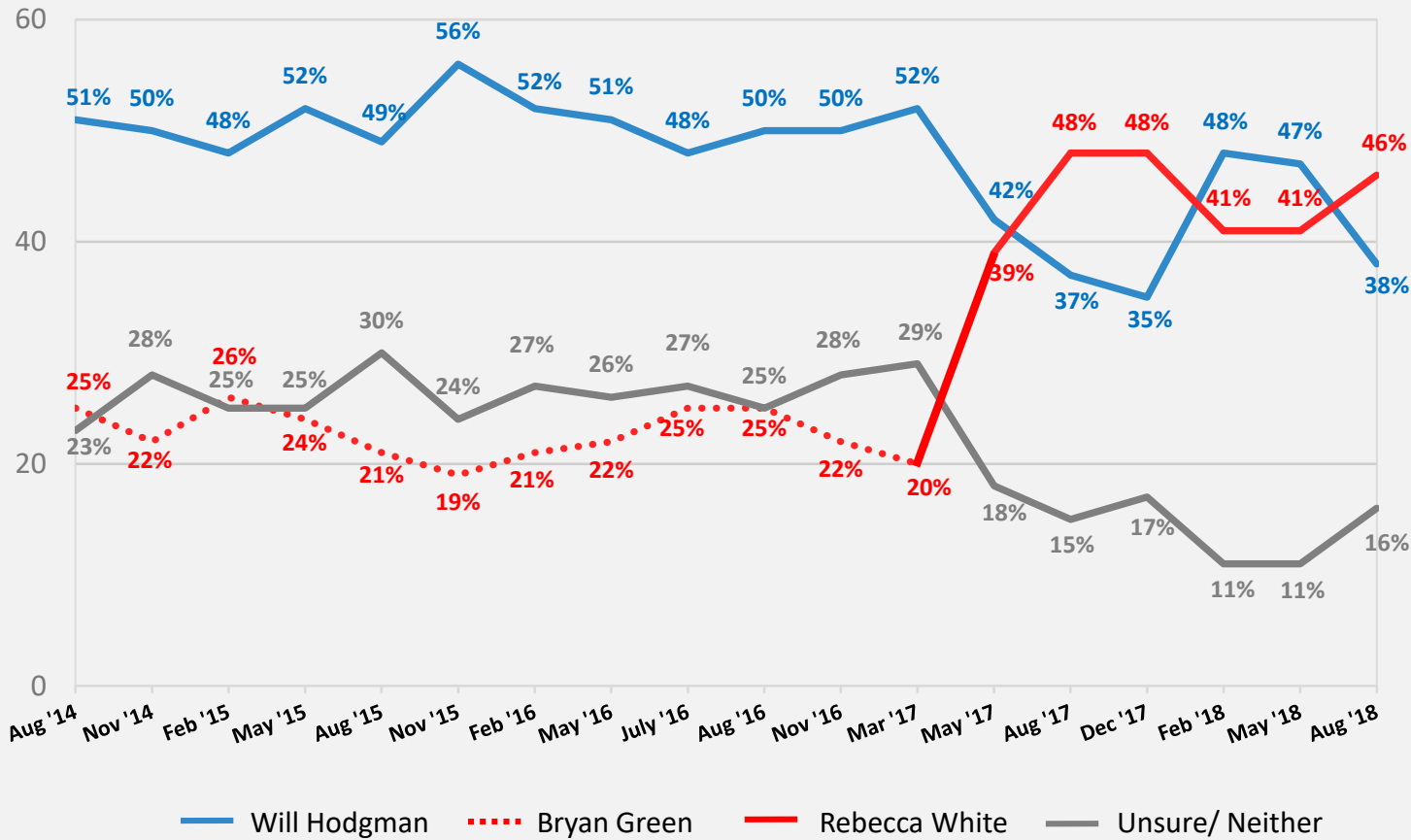
The latest EMRS poll was conducted in the final days of the most recent sitting of State Parliament and less than a week after the Federal Liberal leadership spill and change of Prime Minister.

- Support for the Liberal State Government has decreased significantly by 11 points since the last poll was conducted in May 2018, and currently stands at 36%.
- Support for the Labor Party has increased by 4 points to 34% in the latest poll.
- The Greens support was up slightly, increasing by 2 points to 16%.
- Among the remaining decided voters, 14% said they would vote for an alternative to the three major parties, up from 8% in May 2018.
