

EMRS State Voting Intentions Poll

May 2018

17th May 2018

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Polling was conducted from the 7th to the 10th May 2018.

1,000 adult Tasmanian residents were interviewed and responses weighted to reflect the Tasmanian adult voting population.

A sample of this size provides a margin of error of +/- 3.1 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.

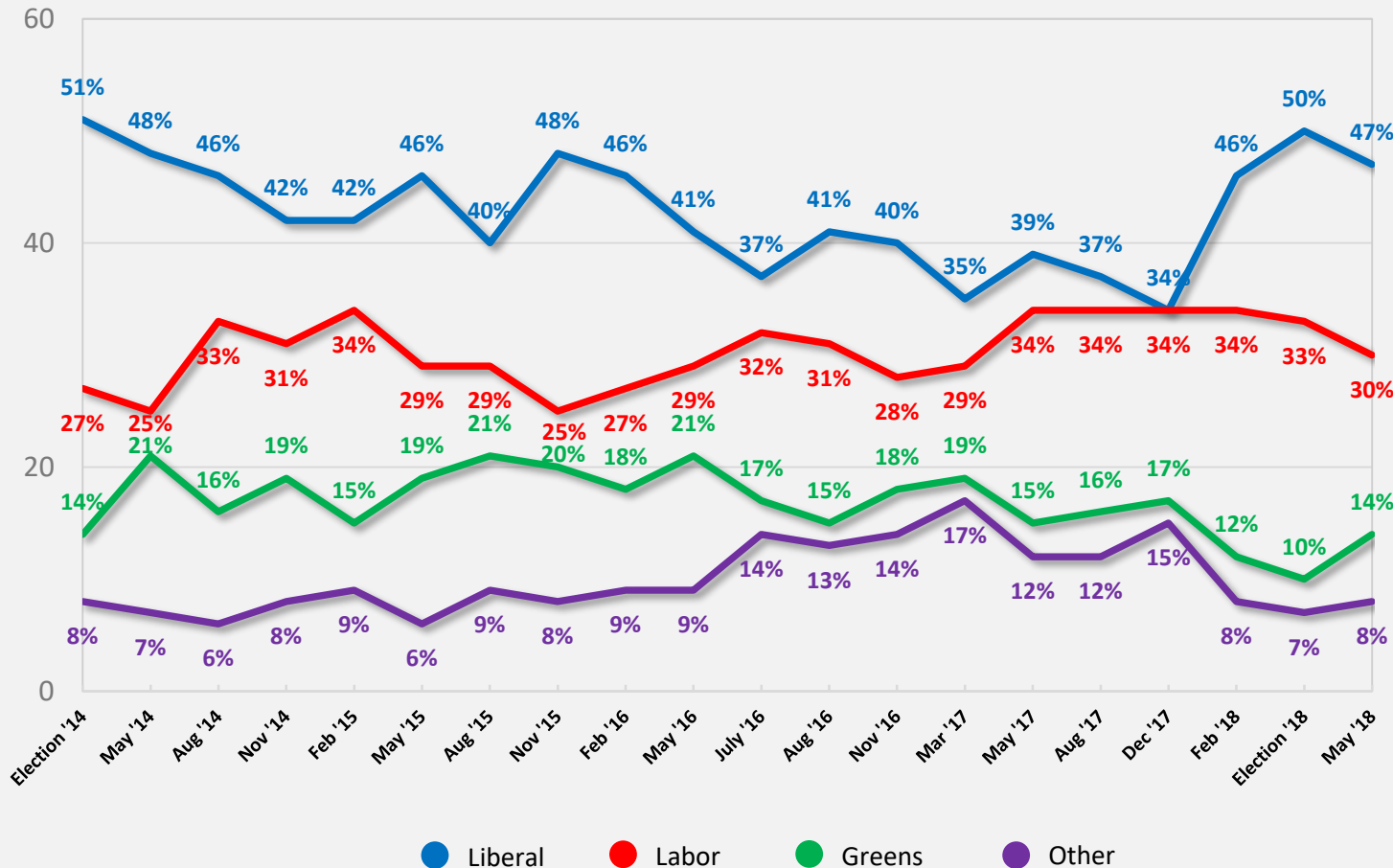

Figure 1 - Decided Voters Supporting or Leaning towards a Party



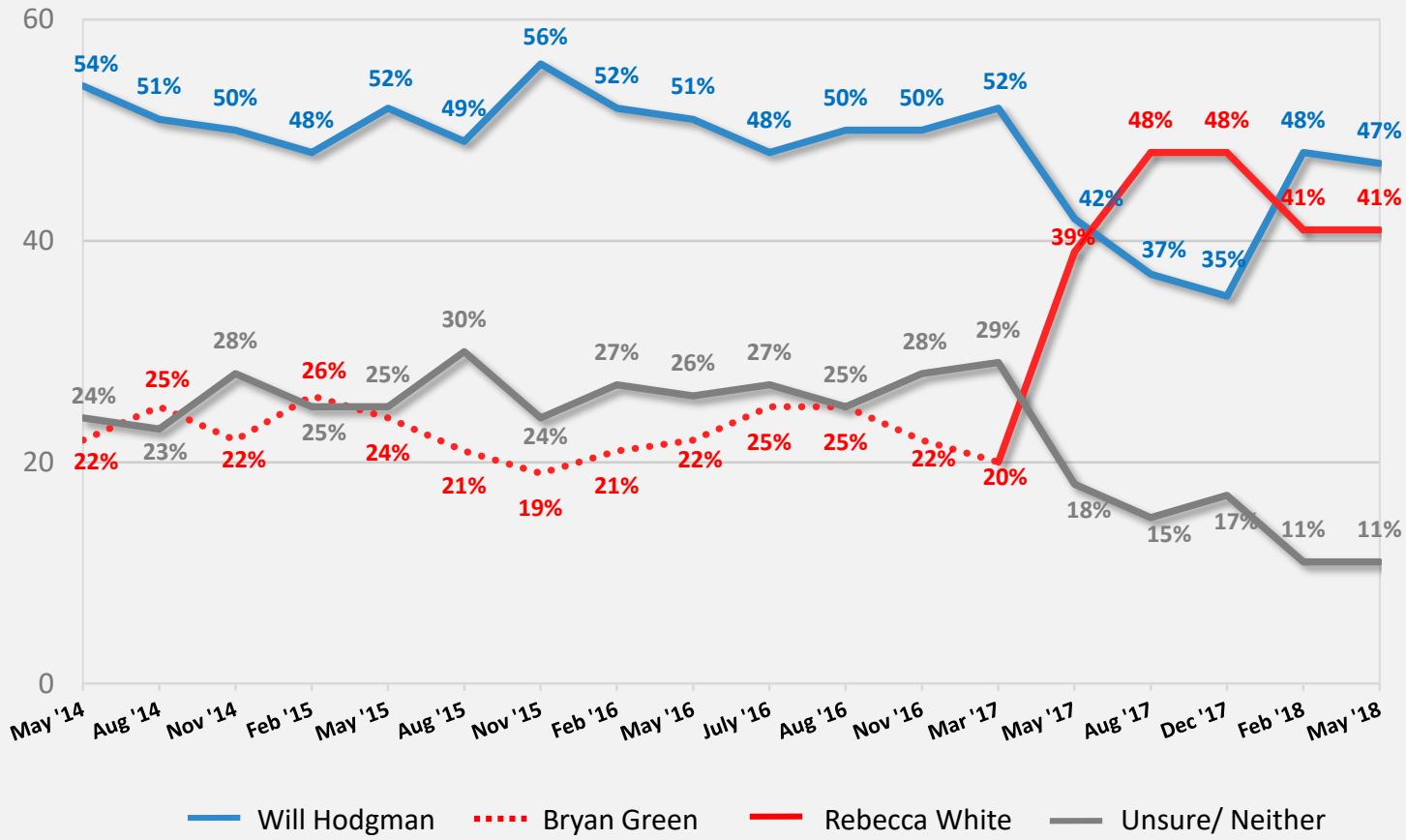
There were no statistically significant differences observed between May 2018 and the previous pre-election February round.

- Support for the Liberal State Government has increased by 1 point since the last poll was conducted prior to the election in February 2018, to 47% currently.
- Support for the Labor Party has decreased, down 4 percentage points to 30% in the latest poll.
- The Greens support was up marginally, increasing by 2 points to 14%.
- Among the remaining decided voters, 8% of the overall sample again stated they would vote for a party other than the three major parties.
